Pronunciation of Verbs Ending in -s and -es

1. If the base form of the verb or noun ends with the sound /s/, /z/, /J/, /3/, /tJ/, /d3/, or /ks/, then pronounce *-es* as an extra syllable /IZ/.

| slice — slices | watch — watches |
|----------------|-----------------|
| lose — loses | judge — judges |
| wash — washes | relax — relaxes |

2. If the base form ends with the voiceless sound /p/, /t/, /k/, /f/, or $/\theta/$, then pronounce *-s* and *-es* as /s/.

sleep — sleeps work — works hit — hits laugh — laughs

3. If the base form ends with any other consonant or with a vowel sound, then pronounce -s and -es as /z/.

learn — learns go — goes
